Dear Mr. Budhwani:

On February 15, 2012, you were mailed a Director's Proposed Action (Proposed Action) regarding denial of your 2012 License to Operate (LTO) a Public Water System (PWS) at Starfuel-Piqua due to violations of ORC Chapter 6109 and the rules adopted there under. The PWS at Starfuel-Piqua has exceeded the acute total coliform maximum contaminant level (MCL), exceeded the monthly total coliform MCL, failed to monitor for total coliform and nitrate, failed to maintain a Class A or higher certified operator, failed to provide public notice and verification forms for violations, and failed to submit acceptable payment of LTO fee for 2011. Additionally, Star One Oil, Inc. has failed to negotiate a settlement of these violations with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

Within thirty (30) days of issuance of a Proposed Action, a request for adjudication is required to be filed should you wish for this matter to go before the Ohio EPA Hearing Officer prior to becoming final. To date, the Ohio EPA Hearing Officer has not received a request for adjudication of your Proposed Action. Pursuant to ORC Section 6109.21(B)(3) and OAC Rule 3745-84-06, the LTO for Star One Oil, Inc. is hereby denied for one (1) year. Therefore, the operation of the PWS at Starfuel-Piqua is prohibited for one (1) year from the effective date of this action listed above.


During the one year LTO denial period, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-84-04, non-community PWSs shall display a red sign issued by Ohio EPA, indicating absence of an LTO so as to be clearly visible to the general public and to any person entering the facility. Per OAC Rule 3745-84-06, no person shall operate a PWS with an expired, denied or revoked LTO. A PWS with an expired, denied or revoked LTO is prohibited from producing water for human consumption as defined in OAC Rule 3745-81-01. This denial may also jeopardize licenses from other agencies, such as your food service license.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30)

days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
