Education and Experience Requirements for Certification of Class A, I, II, and III Personnel

Class A Education and Experience Requirements

Education	Hours/Months of Experience Required

High School Graduate or GED (REQUIRED)	1,040 hours ⁽²⁾	3 years ⁽²⁾
Associates Degree*	780 hours ⁽²⁾	2 years ⁽²⁾
Bachelor's Degree*	520 hours	1 year

* Post High School education shall be obtained in a physical or natural science or chemical, civil or environmental engineering and is subject to review by Operator Certification staff.

(1) Work experience means time spent at a job where a portion of duties involve dealing with a public water system or treatment works.

(2) Successful completion of one or more of the OTCO (operator training committee of Ohio) "Basic Water" or "Basic Wastewater" correspondence course, the California State University at Sacramento "Small Water System Operation and Maintenance" or "Small Wastewater System Operation and Maintenance, Volume I" correspondence course, shall reduce the experience requirement to one year of work experience or five hundred twenty hours of operating experience.

Operating Experience Criteria

(see OAC Rule 3745-7-01 for the definition of operating experience)

Troubleshooting plant operations at a public water system or treatment works. Industrial wastewater treatment Onsite SCADA system monitoring, sludge handling and sludge hauling, if part of a public water system or treatment works, will count for no more than 25 percent of the required experience 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clerical duties Commercial lab work Sludge handling and hauling, if <i>not</i> part of a treatment works Investigations/inspections or construction inspection/engineering design that <u>do not</u> require coordination of work with the active treatment processes, collection or distribution systems.
