**Public Notice: Proposed Rulemaking Governing Monitoring for Compliance with Secondary
Maximum Contaminant Levels**

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Drinking and Ground Waters (DDAGW) drafted revisions to Rule 3745-82-03 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). The draft amendments are, in part, a result of the five-year rule review requirements of Section 106.03 of the Revised Code.

The division drafted revisions to OAC Rule 3745-82-03 to change the way compliance with the fluoride operating range is determined.

As part of the rulemaking process, the Agency is required by Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code to consult with organizations that represent political subdivisions, environmental interests, business interests, and others affected by this rule. Additionally, the Agency is working with the Common Sense Initiative (CSI) Office. The Agency is offering you and your organization the opportunity to comment on the draft rule and CSI Business Impact Analysis (BIA) Form, before the division formally proposes them.
