Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3),  
Response to Request for Alternative Indicator Parameter**

Dear Mr. Traub:

On August 17, 2010, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), Northwest District Office (NWDO) received a document titled "OAC 3745-27-10(D)(3) Request for Alternate List of Inorganic Parameters County Environmental of Wyandot Landfill Wyandot County," dated August 13, 2010, for the County Environmental of Wyandot Landfill (Facility). This document was submitted by Eagon and Associates, Inc., on behalf of the owner, and included a request, in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3), to replace statistical parameter chloride with alkalinity.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3), the owner or operator "may propose, in writing, that an alternative list of inorganic indicator parameters be used to meet the requirements of paragraph (D)(5) of this rule in lieu of some or all of the inorganic parameters listed in appendix I of this rule. The director shall approve the alternative inorganic indicator parameters if the alternative list will provide a reliable indication of inorganic releases from the sanitary landfill facility to the ground water." The owner/operator has submitted a request to replace chloride with alkalinity at the Facility.

Based upon the review of the information submitted to Ohio EPA, the owner/operator has not provided sufficient evidence to demonstrate that alkalinity, in lieu of chloride, will provide a reliable indication of an inorganic release from the Facility. Therefore, I am unable to grant approval to replace chloride with alkalinity as a statistical parameter pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3).

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the

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Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
