

ITEM #2: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADOPTION OF THE COUNCIL FISCAL YEAR 2015 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGETS

The Council adopts a Budget annually which is used as an internal tool for measuring inflow of revenues and outlay of funds. It is also used as a management tool for the Board to evaluate programs and projects of the Council and review the outlay of funds against a benchmark. The attached fiscal year 2015 Budget is proposed to meet the federal requirements of the MPO as well as address the desires of the local elected officials.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-17

ITEM #3: KENTON COUNTY TRANSPORTATION PLAN

A transportation plan for Kenton County was last adopted by the Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana Regional Council of Governments Board in March 2003. The plan was intended to meet Kenton County's transportation needs to year 2030. Over a decade has passed since this plan was adopted and much has changed. Population growth, land use shifts, an economic recession, and a growing elderly population are just a few of the changes that have created new challenges to the way people and goods travel in Kenton County. Due to these factors, a fresh look at Kenton County's current and future transportation needs and how they interact with adjoining land uses was recognized by county leaders and is addressed by this 2014 Kenton County Transportation Plan.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-18

ITEM #4: INTERMODAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE REPORT

A. Amendment #9 of the FY 2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program

The amendment reflected in the proposed resolution lists 11 highway projects in Kentucky that are recommended for addition or revision in the current TIP. Because the scope, cost and timing of included projects is subject to periodic change, and because new projects are continually being developed, the TIP is formally amended several times a year, as needed.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-19

B. Prioritization of Ohio STP and TA Applications

The resolution lists Ohio Surface Transportation Program (STP) and Transportation Alternative (TA) applications for highway, transit and transportation alternative projects that are to be included in the OKI FY 2014 – 2017 TIP and carried forward to the OKI FY 2016 – 2019 TIP when it is adopted in the spring of 2015. The projects shown were reviewed and ranked by the Prioritization Subcommittee on May 6, 2014 and were

recommended for funding. The ICC also reviewed the list of projects at their June 10, 2014 meeting.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-20

C. Joint Cooperative Agreement Between OKI and SORTA for the Section 5310 Program

The federal surface transportation bill, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) creates a regional apportionment for the Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program administered by the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration. The resolution authorizes the Executive Director to enter into a Joint Cooperative Agreement between OKI and SORTA for the purpose of managing the regional allocation of the FTA Section 5310 grant program.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-21

ITEM #5: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RETAINING 4BIS.COM AS SUPPORT FOR THE COUNCIL COMPUTER ADMINISTRATION

The Council has used the services of a consultant as a cost effective method of maintaining the OKI computer network and related technical computer issues. The consultant provides ongoing software and hardware services in an array of administrative and programmatic technical areas. The consultant works one day per week in the OKI offices and is available 24/7 as emergency needs require. The high competency level of this consultant and their knowledge of complex technical/administrative networks, leads staff to request authority to retain the professional services of 4BIS.com for Fiscal Year 2015, at authority level of \$48,000.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-22

ITEM #6: HAMILTON COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) EXTENSION

This amendment will extend the relationship between OKI and the Hamilton County Emergency Management Agency with regards to coordination and development of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) layers to support Homeland Security and transportation planning efforts in our region through June 30, 2015.

Action Recommended: Approval of Resolution OKI 2014-23

ITEM #7: PROPOSED AMENDMENT #38 TO OKI'S WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Amendments to the WQM plan are considered periodically as additional work is undertaken to update, supplement and expand it. Amendment #38 would update the Ohio portion of

ITEM #7: PROPOSED AMENDMENT #38 TO OKI's WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

DESCRIPTION: OKI completed the original Regional Water Quality Management Plan in 1977, as called for by Section 208 of the Clean Water Act. Amendments to the plan are needed periodically to reflect changing circumstances. Amendment #38 is needed to incorporate updated population projections for wastewater facility planning areas in Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren Counties in Ohio. Facility planning areas are delineated in the WQM Plan to permit an analysis of alternatives for wastewater treatment, based on prevailing and projected conditions at the time. One of the conditions is population.

BACKGROUND: The new population projections are based on information made available in the past year by the Ohio Development Services Agency and the U.S. Census Bureau. The projections have a horizon year of 2040 and were developed by OKI staff in consultation with local planners, engineers, wastewater personnel and others knowledgeable about residential development trends in each county. The updated population projections and methodology description have been posted on OKI's website for review by the public and a public hearing was held on May 20, 2014.

WHEREAS, OKI's Executive Committee adopted OKI's regional WQM Plan at its public meeting of February 23, 1978; and



The Warren County Board of County Commissioners supports the proposed amendment to OKI's Regional Water Quality Management Plan (WQM Plan). This request will dissolve the Waynesville wastewater facility planning area (FPA) consisting of property within the Village's municipal boundary and will place this area under Warren County's Caesar Creek FPA. Warren County will become the Designated Management Agency (DMA) for this area and will assume the responsibility of planning, managing, and implementing sanitary sewer and wastewater treatment improvements. This amendment is a necessary step required for the transfer of the Village's wastewater treatment plant and sanitary sewer collection system to Warren County for operation, maintenance, and ownership.

This proposed amendment and pending treatment plant and collection system transfer is the next step in a long lasting relationship between the County and Village that dates back to 1981, when the Village and County entered into the first of a series of Sewer Service Agreements. Over this thirty years period, the County's sewer service area has grown to include the Villages of Corwin and Harveysburg, the Caesar Creek State Park, and developments in Massie and Wayne Townships. The number of County customers have steadily increased, contributing over 25% of the treatment plant's current average daily flow. Additional growth is anticipated in the future with active developments in Harveysburg and Wayne Township.

This proposed amendment allows the County to take responsibility for the treatment plant and collection system and enables the County to devote additional resources to its operation. The County's Water and Sewer Department has a staff of over 70 employees with an operating budget of over \$15 million. The County operates three wastewater treatment plants, over 70 sanitary lift stations, and maintains over 340 miles of sanitary sewers.

Warren County strongly supports this proposed amendment. This amendment will help provide reliable sewer service to residents in and around Waynesville as well as protect water quality within the Little Miami River watershed.

Because the scope, cost and timing of included projects is subject to periodic change, and because new projects are continually being developed, the TIP is formally amended several times a year, as needed.

C. Authorization to Enter into a Contract with a Consultant for the Bright 74 Corridor Study

A selection committee, comprised of representatives from Dearborn County Commission, Dearborn County Engineer's Office, Indiana Department of Transportation and OKI, is completing an extensive review process to select a consultant team to assist the OKI staff in the conduct of the Bright 74 Corridor Study. The selection committee met on June 3 to interview three potential firms. This item is to authorize the Executive Director to execute a contract with a selected consultant in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.

ITEM #4: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RETAINING 4BIS.COM AS SUPPORT FOR THE COUNCIL COMPUTER ADMINISTRATION

The Council has used the services of a consultant as a cost effective method of maintaining the OKI computer network and related technical computer issues. The consultant provides ongoing

software and hardware services in an array of administrative and programmatic technical areas. The consultant works one day per week in the OKI offices and is available 24/7 as emergency needs require. The high competency level of this consultant and their knowledge of complex technical/administrative networks, leads staff to request authority to retain the professional services of 4BIS.com for Fiscal Year 2016, at authority level of \$48,000.

ITEM #5: PROPOSED AMENDMENT #39 TO OKI'S WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Amendments to the WQM plan are considered periodically as additional work is undertaken to update and supplement it. Amendment #39 would revise and update the Ohio portion of the WQM Plan for Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren Counties with a revised Appendix B. Appendix B consists of a Stream Database that incorporates current information from many local, regional state and national sources and is accompanied by a guide, a glossary and mapping. The database contains detailed information about stream conditions in southwest Ohio, such as water quality, water uses, permitting for wastewater treatment plants, stewardship organizations, non-indigenous aquatic species and harmful algal blooms. WHEREAS, OKI has prepared a regional water quality management plan in accordance with applicable law; and


WHEREAS, OKI's Executive Committee adopted OKI's regional WQM Plan at its public meeting of February 23, 1978; and
