

Maintenance Yards and Environmental Requirements

Maintenance yards are tasked to perform a wide variety of activities. These activities can occur at the maintenance yard or at other properties. The activities generate all types of wastes. A good rule of thumb when trying to determine what environmental rules may apply, is to remember the following: all wastes are regulated. Don't throw anything away until you have determine the correct way to manage the waste.

The table below lists activities which may occur at a maintenance yard, showing what wastes or materials may be generated. The last column includes information on which rules may apply. You must consider Solid Waste and Storm Water requirements for all categories.
