



Awarded Grants, June 2013

From the February 2013 application cycle, the review committee of ODOT and Ohio EPA representatives reviewed applications from 60 diesel fleets requesting \$45.6 million. Based on the total cost effectiveness of the projects in reducing diesel emissions, the following 27 grants are awarded, for a total of \$13,720,433.00. Ohio EPA estimates that these projects will achieve an estimated annual emission reduction of more than 704 tons of air pollutants (21 tons of fine particulates and 683 tons of nitrogen oxides) in Ohio counties that currently do not meet or are struggling to meet federal air quality standards. These emission reduction benefits will compound every year that these fleets remain in service. These grants are supported with federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds allocated to Ohio by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), which must make a formal eligibility determination for each project before the grant can be awarded. No project-related advertising or incurred costs are permitted until the project receives written ODOT approval.
