

## Model General Permit (MGP) Qualifying Criteria Document

**Source Description:** Dry to Dry perchloroethylene dry cleaning non-residential facility that uses up to 2100 gallons of perchloroethylene per rolling, 12-month period and is equipped with a carbon adsorber, installed after December 21, 2005.

**MGP Number:** GP2.2

### Qualifying Criteria:

Answer the following questions by checking the appropriate box for the choice that describes the equipment for which you are applying for a permit.

- Yes No 1. Are all non-coin operated dry cleaning machines at this facility dry-to-dry, closed loop machines?
- Yes No 2. Is perchloroethylene the only solvent used in the dry cleaning machines at this facility?
- Yes No 3. Does the facility use no more than 2100 gallons per year of perchloroethylene?
- Yes No 4. Were all dry cleaning machines at the facility installed after December 21, 2005?
- Yes No 5. Is each non-coin operated dry cleaning machine equipped with a refrigerated vapor condenser to condense vapors from the drum?
6. Is each dry cleaning machine equipped with a non-vented carbon adsorber to collect vapors from the machine drum immediately before the door is opened? Note: All perchloroethylene machines installed after December 21, 2005 are required to have a non-vented carbon adsorber.
- Yes No 7. Can the operator of all of the non-coin operated dry cleaning machines at the facility meet the allowable emission limits and all other terms and conditions contained in the Model General Permit?
- Yes No 8. Does the operator of the facility use a halogenated hydrocarbon detector or PCE gas analyzer to check all non-coin operated dry cleaning machines for leaks at least once per month?
- Yes No 9. Is the facility located somewhere other than a building with a residence?
- Yes No 10. Is this dry cleaning facility a stand-alone operation? ("Stand-alone" means dry cleaning is the primary operation done at this facility. If the dry cleaning facility is a minor part of a larger facility such as a university, hospital, military base, check "No" and

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contact the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency about general permit applicability.

If you answered "Yes" to questions 1 through 10 above then the dry cleaning facility meets the above "Qualifying Criteria" for the general permit. Otherwise, the dry cleaning facility is not eligible for a general permit and will, instead, need a standard or traditional permit
