



## Early Stakeholder Outreach – Greenhouse Gas Tailoring Rules

### Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rules 3745-31-34 and 3745-77-11

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#### What rulemaking is Ohio EPA considering?

Ohio EPA is considering amendments to the two rules in response to U.S. EPA comments to make them approvable as a part of Ohio's State Implementation Plan (SIP) under Section 110 of the Clean Air Act and Ohio's fully approved Title V operating permit program.

#### Why is the rule being reviewed; what types of changes are being considered?

Ohio EPA received comments from U.S. EPA Region V on the original version of our rules during their annual SIP and Title V program approval reviews. In addition to making these changes, Ohio EPA is soliciting comments on additional changes that may be necessary.

#### Why is this rulemaking being sent out for Early Stakeholder Outreach?

The first step in the rule-making process is for Ohio EPA to identify that a rule needs to be amended, rescinded, or created. In response to EO 2011-01K, Ohio EPA has added an additional step to ensure stakeholders are brought into the rule process as early as possible. This additional interested party notification and request for information provides opportunity for early input before the rule language has been developed by the Agency.

#### Who will be regulated by this rulemaking?

These rules apply to sources that are subject to federal major source GHG permitting requirements.

#### What is the rulemaking schedule?

The Agency is planning to release a draft version of the rule for interested party review and comment in early 2013.

#### What additional information is the Agency seeking?

The Agency wants to hear from interested stakeholders who may be impacted by this rulemaking. General comments and specific factual information are welcome. Ohio EPA is specifically asking for stakeholders to identify the following:

- Does this rulemaking impact your business?
- Does this rulemaking have an adverse impact on your business? If so, please identify the nature of the adverse impact (e.g., license fees, fines, employer time for compliance).
- Is there an alternative rulemaking (or specific provisions within the rule) that the Agency should consider?
- What are the benefits of the rulemaking? #

#### What should I consider as I prepare my comments?

You may find the following suggestions helpful for preparing your comments:

1. Explain your views as clearly as possible.
2. Describe any assumptions that you used.
3. Provide any technical information and/or data you used that support your views.

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4. If you estimate potential burden or costs, explain how you arrived at your estimate.
5. Provide specific examples to illustrate your concerns.
6. Offer alternatives.
7. Make sure to submit your comments by the comment period deadline.
