Hand Delivery

The Village of Corning (Corning) public water system has violated Ohio's safe drinking water laws. Specifically, Corning has exceeded the total trihalomethanes (TTHM) maximum contaminant level (MCL), failed to notify the public, and has failed to monitor for total coliform bacteria.

**Owners or operators of public water systems that fail to comply with Ohio's safe drinking water laws and regulations are subject to civil penalties of up to \$25,000 per day per violation under Ohio Revised Code Section 6109.33.**

To resolve your drinking water violations and avoid possible legal action and civil penalties:

- 1) Monitor for total coliform bacteria with a minimum of one routine sample per month from the distribution system and perform any required repeat monitoring, in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-81-21.
- 2) By December 1, 2005, post public notices for the total coliform monitoring violation and for exceeding the TTHM MCL. Notices should be posted for no less than seven (7) days in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-32. Send the public notices to:

Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Southeast District Office (SEDO), Division of Drinking and Ground Waters, Attn: Jeff Crisler, 2195 Front Street, Logan, Ohio, 43138.

- 3) By January 1, 2006, submit a Distribution System Optimization Plan to Ohio EPA, SEDO. Within thirty (30) days of receipt, respond to any comments from SEDO on the Distribution System Optimization Plan.


- 4) By April 1, 2006, implement the agreed upon Distribution System Optimization Plan in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-78(G)(2).
- 5) After being supplied with water from Burr Oak Regional Water District (Burr Oak), monitor quarterly for TTHM and haloacetic acids five (HAA5) until the running annual average (RAA) is below the MCL. Take the sample at the PWS's maximum residency (MR001) location to confirm the lowering of TTHM and HAA5. After TTHM and HAA5 RAA's are below the MCL, continue monitoring for TTHM and HAA5 in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-81-24, unless notified otherwise.
- 6) No later than twelve (12) months from the date that Burr Oak begins supplying water from its ground water plant, Corning will be in compliance with the TTHM MCL.
