

Ashtabula

Located in northeast Ohio, the Ashtabula Site is now part of the Department of Energy Office of Legacy Management. This cleanup site and some of the buildings are owned by the RMI Titanium Company Extrusion Plant (formerly Reactive Metals, Inc.). Some of the buildings and equipment are owned by DOE. Between 1962 and 1988, this facility extruded, forged and machined uranium metal received from the DOE Fernald Facility. Following processing, the uranium was shipped back to Fernald for final processing and packaging. Materials were then sent to other DOE facilities as feed for reactors, including Hanford and Savannah River. This work resulted in on-site and off-site contamination of buildings and environmental media.

The contractor declared physical completion on November 1, 2006. The site has been cleaned to support unrestricted use and returned to the site owner. Future use is likely industrial consistent with its zoning ordinance.
