Dear Mr. Roberts:

On November 21, 2007, Ohio EPA issued a draft permit modification to Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. (Envirosafe) to remove permit condition L.1 which required Envirosafe to maintain a document depository at a public library located in the city of Oregon, Ohio. Ohio EPA has determined that the records maintained in the public library are not sufficiently utilized to warrant the resources expended. The Agency received one comment letter from a concerned citizen during the comment period and this comment was addressed in an Ohio EPA letter dated January 9, 2008 which is included with this modification.

I have enclosed the final modified Ohio hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) that was issued by the director today. Please note that the modified Permit remains in effect until it is renewed, withdrawn, suspended or revoked.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:



### OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On February 6, 2008, Ohio EPA issued a final modified Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) to Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. for its facility at 876 Otter Creek Road, Oregon, Ohio 43616. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD045243706.

#### **Why does Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. need this Permit modification?**

Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. (Envirosafe) is permitted to operate a hazardous waste landfill and other related hazardous waste management units at its facility. In accordance with permit condition L.1, Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. must maintain a document depository at a public library located in the city of Oregon, Ohio. Ohio EPA has determined that the records maintained in the public library are not sufficiently utilized to warrant the resources expended and, as such, the Director is initiating this permit modification to remove this permit condition from the facility permit. Use of the internet and email will allow information to be shared in a more convenient and accessible form. This final action contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. #### **Can I appeal this modified permit?**

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

#### **If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?**

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than **March 10, 2007**. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. You must file your appeal, according to Ohio Revised Code § 3745.04 with ERAC at the following address: **Environmental Review Appeals Commission**, 309 South Fourth Street, Room 222, Columbus, Ohio 43215. You must send a copy of the appeal to the director of Ohio EPA at the following address no later than three (3) days after you file it with ERAC: **Chris Korleski, Director of Ohio EPA**, P.O. ## MODULE L - ADDITIONAL CONDITION

L.1 Reserved.

L.2 Fire Control Provisions

Prior to managing hazardous waste in any area of the modified portions of the facility, the Permittee must have available a sufficient supply of water at a nozzle pressure of 100 PSI for use with the Permittee's fire suppression system.

L.3 Surface Water Management

The Permittee must follow the surface water management plan for the entire facility as found in Volume 3C, Appendix D.24 of the approved Part B permit application.

L.4 Maintenance and Abandonment of Other Wells

All other wells or borings that have been installed at the facility that are not addressed in Modules K or E must be operated and maintained to perform to design specifications and when abandoned, should be plugged and abandoned in accordance with the *State of Ohio Technical Guidance for Sealing Unused Wells* (State Coordinating Committee on Ground Water, 1996) and *Ohio EPA's Technical Guidance Manual for Hydrogeologic Investigations and Ground Water Monitoring* (1995). Well plugging and abandonment methods, and certification must be submitted to the director within thirty (30) days from the date the wells are abandoned.

This letter is to acknowledge receipt of your comment regarding Ohio EPA's draft permit to remove the document depository requirement for Envirosafe Services of Ohio, Inc. (ESOI). Yours has been the only comment received by Ohio EPA as of this writing. I also want to take this opportunity to respond to some of the points you made in your comment.

ESOI did not request this action; it was initiated by Ohio EPA. At no time has Ohio EPA approved "whatever ESOI wants."

Generally speaking, the public has not used the document depository. Ohio EPA placed a user survey in the document depository for more than one year. The survey asked questions about frequency of use, types of documents used, usefulness of depository, etc. At the close of the survey period, not one survey was completed and returned to the librarian.


Ohio EPA is committed to keeping the public informed about this site, and has provided information to citizens directly via the Internet, through personnel at the Agency's Northwest District Office or by contacting me. This is actually more attentive to citizens' needs than requiring them to visit the library to obtain documents.
