On July 6, 2007, Ohio EPA received a notification for a Class 1 hazardous waste permit modification from Toxco, Inc. With this letter, Ohio EPA acknowledges the above referenced Class 1 modification submitted pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-50-51, and accordingly has updated the facility's permit.

This permit modification corrected the amount of hazardous waste that Toxco, Inc. is permitted to receive annually, as specified in Permit Condition B.1(b), and was assigned a permit information tracking system (PITS) ID number of OHD071654958-070706-1-1.

## MODULE B - GENERAL FACILITY CONDITIONS

### B. GENERAL FACILITY CONDITIONS

#### B.1 Design and Operation of Facility OAC Rule 3745-54-31

- (a) The Permittee must design, construct, maintain and operate the facility to minimize the possibility of a fire, explosion, or any unplanned sudden or non-sudden release of hazardous waste or hazardous waste constituents to air, soil, ground water or surface waters which could threaten human health or the environment.
- (b) The Permittee must not accept more than 65,000 tons of hazardous waste (i.e., 650,000 tons of waste alkali and acidic batteries and battery components) in any one calendar year from off-site sources during the life of the permit, until such time as this permit condition is modified or renewed. This is a facility wide limitation and includes all units.

#### B.2 Required Notices OAC Rule 3745-54-12

##### (a) Hazardous Waste from Off-Site Sources

When the Permittee is to receive hazardous waste from an off-site source (except where the Permittee is also the generator), he must inform the generator in writing that he has the appropriate permits, and will accept the waste the generator is shipping. The Permittee must keep a copy of this written notice as part of the operating record.

##### (b) Hazardous Wastes from Foreign Sources

The Permittee must notify the Director in writing at least four weeks in advance of the date the Permittee expects to receive hazardous waste from a foreign source, as required by OAC Rule 3745-54-12(A). Notice of subsequent shipments of the same waste from the same foreign source is not required.

- (a) Before an owner or operator treats, stores, or disposes of any hazardous wastes, or nonhazardous wastes if applicable under OAC Rule 3745-55-
