Dear Mr. Jackson:

On October 2, 2009, ABB Inc. submitted to Ohio EPA a closure plan for a concrete pad and former fractionation tank area at the former Basic, Inc. facility located at 495 Emma Street in Bettsville, Ohio. Revisions to the closure plan were received on April 2, 2010, June 14, 2010, July 23, 2010, and October 25, 2010. The closure plan was submitted pursuant to the August 5, 2009, Director's Final Findings and Orders in order to demonstrate that closure at the former Basic, Inc. facility complies with the substantive requirements of OAC rules 3745-55-11 and 3745-55-12.

The owner or operator and the public were given the opportunity to submit written comments regarding the closure plan in accordance with the hazardous waste rule requirements. No public comments were received by Ohio EPA.

Based upon review of ABB Inc.'s submittal and subsequent revisions, I conclude that the closure plan for the hazardous waste facility at 495 Emma Street in Bettsville, Ohio meets the performance standard contained in OAC rule 3745-55-11 and complies with the pertinent parts of OAC rule 3745-55-12.

The closure plan submitted to Ohio EPA on October 2, 2009 and revised on April 2, 2010, June 14, 2010, July 23, 2010 and October 25, 2010, by ABB Inc. and Conestoga-Rovers & Associates is hereby approved.

Compliance with the approved closure plan is expected. Ohio EPA will monitor such compliance. Ohio EPA expressly reserves the right to take action, pursuant to chapters 3734. and 6111. of the Ohio Revised Code, and other applicable law, to enforce such

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compliance and to seek appropriate remedies in the event of noncompliance with the provisions of this Approved Closure Plan. Please be advised that approval of this closure plan does not release Basic, Inc. from any responsibilities regarding corrective action for all releases of hazardous waste or constituents from any waste management unit, regardless of the time at which waste was placed in the unit.

You are hereby notified that this action of the director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission.

Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:

When closure is completed, OAC rule 3745-55-15/3745-66-15 requires the owner or operator of a facility to submit to the director of Ohio EPA, certification by the owner or operator and an independent, registered professional engineer, that the facility has been closed in accordance with the approved closure plan. The certification by the owner or operator shall include the statement found in OAC rule 3745-50-42(D). These certifications should be submitted to:


