Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(4) Approval**

Dear Mr. Matthews:

On July 28, 2014, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Southeast District Office (SEDO) received a document titled "Alternate Parameter List Request – Low Yield SZS Wells," for the Apex Sanitary Landfill (Apex) located in Jefferson County dated July 25, 2014. This document, submitted by Civil & Environmental Consultants Inc. on behalf of Apex Environmental LLC., proposed an alternative parameter list for wells B-402S, B-404S, B-405S, B-407S, and B409S that are considered low yield or dry.

In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(4), Apex is requesting an alternative parameter list, which proposes the removal of the following parameters, to reduce the volume required to collect a complete sample:

- #28 1, 2 Dibromo-3-chloropropane (DBCP);
- #29 1, 2 Dibromoethane, Ethylene dibromide (EDB);
- #67 Temperature (field);
- #68 pH (field);
- #69 Specific conductance (field);
- #70 Total dissolved solids (field);
- #71 Total alkalinity; and
- #76 Turbidity (field).

In order to further reduce the volume needed to collect all remaining parameters, Apex is also proposing to collect the minimum volumes needed by the lab for each bottle. In this way, the required volume can be reduced from approximately 2.5 L to 0.470 L. All parameters that require statistical analysis will continue to be sampled and analyzed.


Ohio EPA has reviewed the submitted information and concurs with the request for alternative parameters. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(4), the owner or operator is hereby authorized to utilize the alternative parameters list for wells B-402S, B-404S, B-405S, B-407S, and B409S as detailed in the July 25, 2014 request.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
