Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(b) Authorization

Dear Mr. Meyer:

By correspondence dated January 17, 2002, the Southwest District Office (SWDO) of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) received from the owner/operator of Pinnacle Road RDF (Facility) notification of a statistically significant increase of vinyl chloride in ground water monitoring well MW-9TS, and a request pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(b), to reinstate detection ground water monitoring for monitoring well MW-9TS.

In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(b), the owner or operator may demonstrate that a statistically significant change in ground water monitoring parameter(s) was not a result of leachate migration from the landfill.

A ground water demonstration dated January 17, 2002, and addendum dated April 22, 2002, were submitted to Ohio EPA indicating the statistically significant increase of vinyl chloride concentration (5.8 µg/L and 7.1 µg/L) in monitoring well MW-9TS was not leachate-derived, but is the result of subsurface migration of landfill gas. Ohio EPA concurs with the demonstration that the ground water contamination is not the result of a leachate impact. Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(b), the owner/operator is hereby authorized to reinstate ground water detection monitoring at MW-9TS in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D).

Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant increases in ground water monitoring parameters, the owner/operator will be required to either enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E), or obtain an approval to remain in the detection monitoring program pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c).

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (Commission) pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set
