**Re: Carbon Limestone Landfill, Mahoning County
OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(9)(a) Approval**

Dear Mr. Truzzi

By document dated September 18, 2003, Browning Ferris Industries of Ohio, Inc. (BFIO) submitted two requests to reinstate several ground water monitoring wells at its Carbon Limestone Landfill located in Mahoning County. The first request was for monitoring wells MW-104A, P-27AA, and P-34A. The second request was for monitoring well P-32A.

Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(E)(9)(a) states:

"If the owner or operator determines that the concentrations of all waste-derived constituents are shown to be at or below background values, using the statistical procedures described in paragraph (C)(6) of this rule for two consecutive sampling events, then the owner or operator may request, in writing, that the director approve reinstatement of the detection monitoring program described in paragraphs (C) and (D) of this rule."

The December 2002 and May/June 2003 sampling events indicated that all waste-derived constituents were at or below background values at monitoring wells MW-104A, P-27AA, P-34A, and P-32A. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(9)(a), I hereby approve reinstatement of monitoring wells MW-104A, P-27AA, P-34A, and P-32A to the detection monitoring program.

Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant differences in ground water monitoring parameters, BFIO will be required to either enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E) or obtain approval to remain in the detection monitoring program.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the

grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the commission within 30 days after notice of the director's action. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director within three days after the appeal is filed with the commission.
