Continuation of Ground Water Detection Monitoring Program**

Dear Ms. Jones:

On July 21, 2004, the Southeast District Office of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) received the verification Resampling Demonstration for monitoring well MW-1R for the Allied Landfill in Vinton County. Monitoring well MW-1R underwent verification resampling on May 14, 2004. This sampling event yielded a value of 5 mg/L chloride, which is slightly lower than the original value of 6 mg/L chloride.

The demonstration was reviewed by the Division of Drinking and Ground Waters (DDAGW) and the Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM). Upon review, the data submitted meets the requirements of Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c) for an alternate source demonstration. In particular, the report provides adequate evidence that the statistically significant increase of chloride in MW-1R resulted from natural variation in ground water. Therefore, Ohio EPA approves continuation of the detection monitoring program in accordance with OAC 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c) for the parameter specified above.

Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant increases in ground water monitoring parameters, the owner/operator will be required to either enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E) or obtain an approval to remain in the detection monitoring program.

You are hereby notified that this action of the director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. It must be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission within 30 days after notice of the director's action. A copy of the appeal must be served on the director of the Environmental Protection Agency within three days of filing with the Commission. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:
