**RE: Statewide Landfill, Inc., Stark County  
Selection of Corrective Measures**

Dear Mr. Haaf:

On August 30, 2001, The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a Corrective Measures Plan for Statewide Recycling and Disposal Facility (RDF). Subsequently, a revised Corrective Measures Plan (CMP) titled "*Corrective Measures Plan for Statewide Recycling and Disposal Facility, Stark County, Ohio,*" dated December 9, 2005, was submitted to Ohio EPA by Eagon and Associates, Inc., on behalf of Waste Management, Inc., and was received by NEDO on December 12, 2005.

Statewide RDF closed under the 1990 Solid Waste Landfill regulations, but is required to conduct post-closure ground water detection and assessment monitoring in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rules 3745-27-10(D) and (E), as effective August 15, 2003. The CMP was reviewed for compliance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(F)(2).

Ohio EPA has reviewed the CMP and has determined the CMP fulfills the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-27-10(F). Therefore, pursuant to OAC rule 3745-27-10(F)(10), I hereby select the following, which are the recommended actions outlined in Sections 4.2.1—Significant Zone of Saturation (SZS) Alternate 1 and 4.3.3—Uppermost Aquifer System (UAS) Alternate 3 of the CMP, as corrective measures that are to be implemented at the Facility:

- maintain the existing source control with continued ground water monitoring for the SZS;
- employ accelerated natural attenuation and ground water monitoring for the UAS; and
- perform annual ground water sampling of residential wells to establish a baseline.

Statewide RDF shall implement the CMP for all applicable ground water monitoring wells at the facility and shall comply with the following conditions:

### **CONDITIONS**

1. Statewide RDF shall maintain the existing source control with continued ground water monitoring for the Lower Kittanning Coal #5 SZS;
2. Statewide RDF shall employ accelerated natural attenuation and ground water monitoring for the Clarion Shale UAS; and
3. Statewide RDF shall perform annual ground water sampling of residential wells—identified as wells number 7, 12, 255, and 256 in the Final Ground Water Quality Assessment Report—located immediately downgradient of the proposed corrective measures activities to establish a baseline and ensure corrective actions do not adversely impact ground water quality at these wells.

### **END OF CONDITIONS**

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
