Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Approval**

Dear Mr. Haaf:

On December 31, 2012, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a document titled *Statistical Analysis Program for Ground Water Detection Monitoring – Statewide Recycling and Disposal Facility* dated December 2012, for the Statewide RDF (Facility) located in Stark County. This document was submitted by Eagon and Associates, Inc., on behalf of the Facility. The Facility has proposed using the statistically significant data from monitoring wells MWU-1 and MWU-8 for chloride and MWU-6 for sodium as part of the Facility's background data.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), background data can be added only in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to the current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable to the director.

Ohio EPA has reviewed the applicable information and concurs with the addition of the above data to existing background data. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), the owner or operator is hereby authorized to update the background data group for chloride at monitoring wells MWU-1 and MWU-8 and for sodium at MWU-6 as detailed in the December 31, 2012, submittal.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:

On December 31, 2012, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a document titled *Statistical Analysis Program for Corrective Measures Monitoring – Statewide Recycling and Disposal Facility, Revision 4* dated December 2012, for the Statewide RDF (Facility) located in Stark County. This document was submitted by Eagon and Associates, Inc., on behalf of the Facility. The Facility has proposed using the statistically significant data from monitoring wells MW5C-1 for chloride, potassium and sodium; MW5C-3 for vanadium; and, MW5C-4 for arsenic, chloride and vanadium as part of the Facility's background data.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), background data can be added only in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to the current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable to the director.

Ohio EPA has reviewed the applicable information and concurs with the addition of the above data to existing background data. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), the owner or operator is hereby authorized to update the background data group for chloride, potassium and sodium at monitoring well MW5C-1; vanadium at MW5C-3; and, arsenic, chloride and vanadium at MW5C-4 as detailed in the December 31, 2012, submittal.
