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Pretreatment; Adding/Deleting Program

APPLICABLE

REGULATIONS: 40 CFR 403, ORC 3745-3-03

PURPOSE: To provide procedures to use when proposing to add or delete the requirement to develop and implement a local pretreatment program. The purpose of this policy is to develop consistent procedures to be used when a publicly owned treatment works (POTW) is being considered for the requirement to develop and implement a local pretreatment program.

POLICY: This policy is applicable to all POTWs. This policy may be used when information is identified regarding a specific POTW warranting the development and implementation of a local pretreatment program or when a situation changes sufficiently with an approved pretreatment program to warrant revoking a POTW's program.

Evaluate available information. Considerations for adding or deleting programs should include: the POTW's capability of implementing a pretreatment program; the presence of industrial users regulated by categorical standards; and the presence of industrial users discharging pollutants which may pass through the POTW untreated or interfere with the treatment works.

Where a POTW has been identified as requiring a pretreatment program, the district office should send a briefing memo to central office describing the justification for adding the POTW and a draft set of director's findings and orders setting a schedule for the POTW to develop a pretreatment program and requiring submission of a final application. Central office will process these findings and orders as final actions of the director.

Where a POTW has been identified as no longer requiring a pretreatment program, the district office should send a briefing memo to central office identifying significant changes which justify relieving the POTW of the requirement to implement their program. A draft NPDES permit modification deleting pretreatment requirements from the permit should accompany the memo.

Central Office will process director's findings and orders as final actions by the director to revoke approved pretreatment programs, and permit modifications.
