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## Ohio EPA Issues Final Air Permits for DP&L Landfill in Adams Co.

Ohio EPA has issued final air permits for Dayton Power and Light (DP&L) to construct and operate the company's proposed Carter Hollow Landfill off Ginger Ridge Rd., north of U.S. 52 and east of Co. Rd. 11 in Sprigg Township (Adams County). The 245-acre residual waste management facility would primarily accept flue-gas desulfurization gypsum from DP&L's J.M. Stuart and Killen Stations, though DP&L also is considering disposing of dry coal ash (fly ash and bottom ash).

### **Final Air Permits**

Ohio EPA held a hearing on July 6, 2011, to answer questions and accept comments regarding the draft air permits. These final permits will allow DP&L to construct and operate the landfill, build new roads and modify DP&L's J.M. Stuart Station roads. Ohio EPA issued the permits after ensuring that emissions from the Carter Hollow Landfill project would comply with federal and state air pollution control standards, laws and regulations. The permits establish emission limits to protect public health and the environment.
