Ohio EPA Requests Recognition of Improved Air Quality in Northeast Ohio; Public Hearing to be Held September 23

The State of Ohio plans to ask U.S. EPA to officially recognize that air quality in the Cleveland-Lorain-Akron area meets the 1997 federal fine particulate standard.

An Ohio EPA public hearing to take comments on the proposal will be held on Sept. 23, 2011. The hearing will begin at 2:30 p.m., at the Twinsburg Library, 10050 Ravenna Rd., Twinsburg.

Air quality data from 2008-2010 show that the Cleveland-Lorain-Akron area is meeting the 1997 national fine particulate matter standard. When asking for redesignation, states are required to demonstrate that the metropolitan area will be able to maintain compliance with the fine particulate standard for 10 years. Current national, state and local air pollution controls to limit particulate emissions will enable the area to maintain the air quality, including: lower emissions from coal-burning power plants, additional controls on diesel-powered vehicles and enforcement efforts.

The proposed redesignation request affects Ashtabula, Cuyahoga, Lake, Lorain, Medina, Portage and Summit counties.

The national fine particulate standard regulates tiny particles, about 1/30th the diameter of a human hair, which lodge deep in human lungs. Particulate matter has been associated with heart attacks, chronic bronchitis, asthma attacks and missed days of school and work.
