

# 2017 State Revolving Fund Year-in-Review

In 2017, the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund (WPCLF), Water Supply Revolving Loan Account (WSRLA) and the Water Resource Restoration Sponsor Program (WRRSP) funded 196 projects for a total of \$936,543,803. All funds are awarded at below-market interest rates, some as low as zero percent, saving Ohioans at least \$150 million in interest expenses assuming a standard below-market interest rate.

#### **Other Special/Unique Projects**

- Through the WPCLF, Ohio EPA awarded five loans to the **City of Columbus**, totaling \$21,475,467 to further their *Blueprint Columbus* initiative. These funds were used for Green Infrastructure improvements, as well as sewer lateral lining and roof water redirection. In addition, Columbus received 12 other WPCLF loans totaling \$133,944,095. Columbus also received four WSRLA loans totaling \$12,883,434. All total, Columbus received 21 loans for \$168,302,996 through the WPCLF and WSRLA.
- The **City of Akron** received nine total loan awards: eight WPCLF awards (\$54,694,088) and one WSRLA award (\$741,878).
- The Board of County Commissioners of **Hamilton County** received four WPCLF loan awards, totaling \$172,836,965.
- The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer
   District received four loans awards totaling \$167,517,475.
- Two large-diameter CSO tunnels were funded during the year: Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District's Doan Valley Storage Tunnel (DVT) CSO (8/30/2017, \$142,320,000) and Board of County Commissioners of Hamilton County's Lick Run Valley Conveyance System NRD CSO (8/30/2017, \$122,243,997).
- Smaller loans Most state revolving funds are awarded to smaller projects. Of the 196 projects financed, 108 of them were less than \$1 million.

# 2017 Revolving Fund Year-in-Review

### Home Sewage Treatment System (HSTS) Replacement and Upgrades

The WPCLF totals include \$13,169,600 in principal forgiveness loan awards to 51 counties for HSTS programs. The maximum amount per county was \$300,000; the average amount was \$258,227. Counties have until the end of 2018 to utilize their 2017 loan awards.

#### **Principal Forgiveness**

A total of \$36,811,708 in principal forgiveness was awarded during the year — \$9,325,395 through the drinking water (WSRLA) program and \$27,486,313 through the clean water (WPCLF) program. All HSTS projects mentioned previously are included in the WPCLF total, but not shown on the table below.
