Kristopher Weiss. I am a public involvement coordinator in Ohio EPA's Public Interest Center and will preside over today's public hearing.

Thank you for taking time to attend this hearing before the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. The purpose of the hearing today is to obtain comments from any interested person regarding plans to request U.S. EPA to officially revise the current air quality designation from nonattainment to attainment for the Cleveland-Akron-Lorain, Ohio 2008 eight-hour ozone standard nonattainment area. This area is comprised of Ashtabula, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain, Medina, Portage and Summit counties. Air quality monitoring data collected between 2013 and 2015 in the region demonstrated attainment of the 2008 eight-hour ozone standard and there is evidence that the improvement in air quality is due to permanent, enforceable emission reductions. In addition, Ohio's proposed maintenance plan demonstrates existing requirements are sufficient to maintain the 2008 eight-hour ozone standard in this area at

least ten years into the future. As part of an acceptable maintenance plan, Ohio EPA is required to develop a contingency plan to provide for additional emissions reductions if a violation of the NAAQS is monitored after the area has been redesignated. The contingency plan which Ohio EPA is proposing to U.S. EPA as part of this action contains additional reductions which could help alleviate any violations until a revised SIP could be developed.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented, and to present oral and/or written comments concerning the proposed action. All written and oral comments received as part of the official record will be considered by the director of Ohio EPA.

To be included in the official record, written comments must be received by Ohio EPA by close of business, today June 27, 2016. These comments may be filed with me today or e-mailed to Erica.fettydavis@epa.ohio.gov. All written comments submitted for the record receive the same consideration as oral testimony given today.

Written statements submitted after today may be considered as time and circumstances permit, but will not be part of the official record of the hearing.
