Because universal waste does not require a hazardous waste manifest, it is not considered hazardous waste under the department of transportation regulations.</p> <p>Some universal waste materials are regulated by the Department of Transportation as hazardous materials because they meet the criteria for one or more hazard classes specified in 49 CFR 173.2. As universal waste shipments do not require a manifest under Chapter 3745-52 of the Administrative Code, they may not be described by the DOT proper shipping name "hazardous waste, (l) or (s), n.o.s.," Nor may the hazardous material's proper shipping name be modified by adding the word "waste."</p>
