Ohio EPA's Role - RE: Nutrients

- Regulation (scope is set by law)
 - Point source discharge permits
 - Standards (set uses of water and how clean)
 - Monitoring
 - Total Maximum Daily Loads
- Incentives
 - Grants & loans for PS and NPS projects
- Leadership & partnering
 - State agency with authority over water quality



Why Build a Nutrient Strategy?

- Widespread impacts on water quality
 - High value recreation areas are at peril
 - Increasing costs to treat drinking water
- Find solutions that work for Ohio
 - Flexibility
 - Build on existing strengths, innovation where needed
 - Prioritize actions that reduce nutrient delivery



Steps Taken to Date

- 2009 research other examples & guidance
 - Gulf of Mexico Alliance template
 - U.S. EPA expectations
- Framework for Ohio's Strategy (Nov. 2011)
- Form specialized work groups
 - Lake Erie Phosphorus Task Force (1 & 2)
 - Director's Agricultural Water Quality Workgroup
 - Point Source & Urban Runoff Workgroup



Next Steps

- Finalize Framework document:
 - Work group recommendations
 - Fill in gaps on load reduction calculations and tracking, priority setting and funding needs
 - Consider feedback from today's workshop
- Continue dialogue with U.S. EPA on aspects of nutrient standards for surface water
